### **1. What to do?**

- A.** Get a library card. Each child that is participating needs to have their own library card. Toddlers to children who have completed 5<sup>th</sup> grade may enroll in the program.  
If you've completed 6<sup>th</sup> grade, register with the teen program!  
And if you're over 17, we have a program for adults, too!
- B.** Bring your library card and register with the Children's Services desk anytime between June 1<sup>st</sup> and June 30<sup>th</sup>.  
Receive your reading log and go!
- C.** Bring your reading log when you visit the Library. Each bubble equals 15 minutes of reading. Just color the bubbles and see how many you can fill in. The first, and best, prize is a FREE BOOK! Each week you check in you will be entering drawings to win great prizes.
- D.** The Library Foundation has pledged \$500 to be donated to the "Courage is Change" nonprofit. Their mission is to create a curriculum for school age children that teaches non-violent resolutions, healthy relationship skills, coping skills and to create and promote healthy communities. By all of us reading 14,000 hours, we can help this worthy cause in our community.

### **2. Some things to know**

- A.** You won't need your card once you've registered, but you MUST bring your reading log in order to check in each week.
- B.** One check in per week. You can start returning for check-ins Sunday, June 6<sup>th</sup>. No check-ins for weeks missed or weeks on vacation.

- C. HALFWAY THERE??? There will be prizes awarded after 6 hours read.
- D. Lakeside tickets will be awarded after 12 hours read.
- E. Time sensitive prizes (ex. game tickets) may be forfeited to a runner up if not picked up within a reasonable time frame.
- F. No check-ins or registrations 10 minutes prior to library closing time.
- G. Maximum one raffle prize per week.

### **3. A request from your library staff**

We ask your cooperation when using the Library with your children. Please keep young children with you at all times for their protection and the benefit of all Library users. Sound carries throughout this building, and noise levels rise considerably—especially before and after programs and events.
